

CANADIAN SCORING SYSTEM

Advice from BCRA on scoring system used in Canada.

The picture shows the scoring disc as a V-bull as the spotting disc is on the line of the V-bull section of the target.

The description that goes with this picture is:

... The scoring marker is the larger orange disc. There is a second smaller disc that is placed in the shot hole to show exactly where the shot has passed through the target. This is called a spotting disc.

For Target Rifle Disciplines:

- A shot fired that does not hit the scoring surface is a miss
- The target surface outside of the Outer ring scores 1 point
- The Outer scores 2 points
- The Magpie scores 3 points
- The Inner scores 4 points
- The Bull's-eye scores 5 points
- The V-bull scores 5 points (designated V)

For 10 shots, the maximum score is 50, with 10 V's

For F-Class Disciplines:

- A shot fired that does not hit the scoring surface is a miss
- The target surface outside of the Outer ring scores 1 point
- The Outer scores 2 points
- The Magpie scores 3 points
- The Inner scores 4 points
- The Bull's-eye scores 5 points
- The V-bull scores 6 points (currently designated V)

For 10 shots, the maximum score is 60
